After the word "shall," in the first line of the second enacting clause, strike out to the end of the line, and insert "nominate and recommend to the governor and the council three persons, of whom the governor, with the advice of the council, shall appoint and commission one, to be inspector of the said warehouse, in the manner directed in the fifth and sixth sections of an act passed at November session, in the year seventeen hundred and eighty-nine, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco." In the 3d line from the bottom, strike out the word "county," and insert "proprietor or proprietors aforesaid."

The bill to empower the justices of Queen-Anne's county to levy a sum of money to complete the court-house and gaol at Centre-Ville, in said county, endorsed; "By the senate, December 6, 1791: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table."

And a petition from sundry subscribers, inhabitants of Baltimore-town, relative to the appointment of a chief justice of the criminal court, endorsed; "By the senate, December 6, 1791: Read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates."
