Mr. Speaker laid before the house the following report :

To the honourable the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of the STATE of MARYLAND.

THE Agent for the Accounts of Maryland, begs leave to lay before the honourable the legislature the following report :

That he did, on the 29th of March last year, forward, by the general post, a state of the progress of his agency, of which the following is a copy; that by some unaccountable mismanagement, the said report never came before the legislature, either at their meeting in April, 1792, as it was designed to do, or in the session of the November following, but was returned to your agent at Philadelphia in the month of May last, as will appear by certificates on the original papers, which he has the honour to present with the present report.

“ Philadelphia, 29th March, 1792.

“ The Agent for the Accounts of Maryland against the United States, begs leave to lay before the honourable legislature the following report :

“ That the abstract which he has the honour to enclose, amounting to 8,865,590  $\frac{77}{100}$   $\frac{7}{100}$  dollars, is a general exhibit of the account of the state against the United States, and although part of the charges
