THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Bennett Hurft, do report, that they have taken the fame into confideration, and are of opinion, that in as much as all papers, allegations and facts, which have been fubmitted to the confideration of your committee, have been heretofore laid before the honourable the chancellor, who thereupon hath judicially given his decree againft the petitioner, legislative interpoftion cannot constitutionally be had, fo as to reverse the faid decree, and that therefore the prayer of the petitioner ought not to be granted.

Mr. Ridgely, of Wm. from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the petition of Elam Bailey, of Baltimore county, praying for a re-valuation of the damages fufained by the turnpike road going through his land in faid county, and owing to his not having had due notice previous to the former jury's valuation, have taken the fame into confideration, and find the facts therein ftated to be true, and are of opinion that the prayer of the petitioner ought to be granted.
