THE house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Whereas it is represented to this house, that the warrant issued the seventh instant to the sheriff of Cæcil county, for the election of two members to represent that county in the house of delegates, and returnable on or before the twenty-fifth instant, cannot be returned within the time limited in the said warrant; therefore, RESOLVED, That the time for returning the said warrant be extended to, and returnable on or before, the sixth day of December next, and that the speaker be requested to transmit to the said sheriff a copy of this resolve.

Petitions from Lewis Duvall, of Montgomery county, and Philip Heide, of Baltimore-town, praying acts of insolvency, were preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

Mr. Ridout, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the account of the register of the land-office for the western shore, report, that having examined his account and vouchers, they find, that between the second day of October, seventeen hundred and ninety-three, and the second day of October, seventeen hundred and ninety-four, he has received the sum of thirty-three pounds current money, for taxes on proceedings in the land-office, and that he has regularly accounted for and paid over the same to the treasurer for the western shore, first deducting his commission therefrom, amounting to the sum of one pound six shillings and four-pence and four fifths of a penny current money. All which is submitted to the house.
