ORDERED, That Mr. Earle, Mr. Kent, Mr. Brown, Mr. Brome and Mr. Wilson, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The report on the petition for incorporating the trustees of Cokesbury college, was read the second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That Mr. Montgomery, Mr. J. Johnson, Mr. Kent, Mr. M'Comas and Mr. J. Bond, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Carroll, seconded by Mr. Wilson, RESOLVED, That this house will, on the third day of December next, go into the nomination of persons, residents of the eastern shore of Maryland, from whom one shall be chosen by the general assembly to represent this state in the senate of the United States.

A petition from Andrew Suplee, of Baltimore-town, praying an act of insolvency, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee on petitions of a similar nature.

On motion by Mr. Winchester, seconded by Mr. M'Kim, Leave given to bring in a bill to regulate the police of Baltimore-town. ORDERED, That Mr. Winchester, Mr. M'Kim, Mr. Ridgely, of William, Mr. Dennis and Mr. Dorsey, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill to alter the mode of collecting the county tax in Harford county, was read the second time, and passed. Sent to the senate by the clerk.

A petition from Aaron Harris, of Montgomery county, praying an act of insolvency, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee on petitions of a similar nature.

Mr. Earle, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, An act to enable the inhabitants of Christ Church parish, in Queen-Anne's county, to elect vestrymen and churchwardens for said parish; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill for the establishment of a market for the sale of live stock at Westminster-town, in Frederick county, was read the second time, and passed. Sent to the senate by the clerk.
