That it appears to your committee, certificates, agreeably to an act for the liquidation and payment of debts against persons convicted of treason, and British subjects, and the supplementary acts thereto, paid sundry claimants, amounting to £. 316 12 5½; and certificates for the payment of the journal of accounts, paid sundry persons, to the amount of £. 32 15 1.

That your committee have counted and burnt the sum of £. 10 8 0 of the bills of credit emitted by an act of assembly of the 8th of June, 1780, and the further sum of £. 265 10 0 of the bills of credit made by an act of congress of the 18th of March, 1780.

That your committee have examined and cancelled certificates for debts adjusted to the amount of £. 1,788 14 10, certificates issued for continental certificates liquidated amounting to £. 118 6 5, depreciation certificates to the amount of £. 1,668 2 0, certificates for debts against persons convicted of treason amounting to £. 2,111 2 10, and the further sum of £. 50 12 2 journal certificates.

That it appears to your committee, by the accounts of said treasurer, he hath paid away, from the 1st of November, 1794, to November the 1st, 1795, the sum of £. 26,037 5 2½ specie, 550 dollars 14 cents funded 6 per cent. stock, and 1,898 dollars 18 cents 3 per cent. stock; for all which payments have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts; and that there remains in the treasury the sum of 230,225 dollars 64 cents funded 6 per cent. stock, 262,184 dollars 25 cents 3 per cent. stock, 55,718 dollars 79 cents deferred 6 per cent. stock, and £. 33,916 7 1 specie; which sum of specie is appropriated in the manner following, viz.

That it appears to your committee there is the sum of £. 8,850 0 0 in the treasury of the emissions made by an act of congress of the 18th of March, 1780, it being part of the one tenth of the bills that became issuable in exchange for old continental money, and appropriated for the purpose of calling out of circulation the bills of credit emitted by acts of assembly and resolves of convention of this state. That your committee find, by the last report, there was the sum of £. 3,322 8 1 in said bills remaining in the treasury, paid in on account of British creditors, which said sum still remains in the treasury.
