

The additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to straighten and amend the several public roads in the several counties, and for other purposes therein mentioned, was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill declaring a certain road in Worcester county a public highway, was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Clarke, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to appoint a trustee in the place of John Cradock, of Baltimore county, who is dead; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

A petition from Samuel Turner, register of wills of Montgomery county, praying the levy court may be authorized to levy a sum of money on the said county for building a house as an office, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. P. Magruder, Mr. R. Magruder and Mr. Riley, to consider and report thereon.

The amendments to the bill authorizing the justices of the levy court of Somerset county to levy a sum of money on the assessable property of the said county for building a prison in the said county, and other purposes therein mentioned, were read the second time, agreed to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill to authorize the justices of the peace of Kent county at their next levy court to levy and assess a sum of money on the assessable property thereof for the benefit of Anne Smyth, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

The petition of sundry inhabitants of Montgomery county, referred from the last to the present session, was read, and referred to Mr. P. Magruder, Mr. R. Magruder and Mr. Riley, to consider and report thereon.

The bill to authorize the levy court of Prince-George's county to assess and levy annually a sum of money for the support and maintenance of the children of Catharine Havies, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the senate by the clerk.

On motion, the question was put, That the committee appointed to take into consideration the memorial of the president and directors of the Patowmack company make their report on or before tomorrow 12 o'clock? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

ORDERED, That the bill to alter, abolish and repeal, such parts of the second, third, fourteenth and forty-second sections of the constitution and form of government, as relate to the judges, time, place and manner, of holding the several elections therein specified, be committed for amendment.

The report on the petition of William Barroll was read the second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That Mr. Key, Mr. T. Buchanan, Mr. Chapman, Mr. Clarke and Mr. Goldsbrough, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

A petition from William Hammond, of Anne-Arundel county, counter to the petition from the mayor and aldermen of the city of Annapolis, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Hall, Mr. Godman and Mr. J. C. Thomas, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Thomas Harwood, junior, of Calvert county, praying an act of insolvency, was preferred, read, and referred to the committee appointed on petitions of a similar nature.

Mr. Bruce, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to alter and amend a certain erroneous patent; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Emerson, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to amend the defective entries in the records of the orphans court of Calvert county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The resolution respecting Robert Swailles was read the second time, and the question put, That the house assent thereto? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
