THE committee to whom were referred the petition of Robert Amos, of Harford county, and the petition of Archibald Robinson and Thomas Barton, administrators of James Barton, deceased, of said county, both praying that a resolution may pass to entitle them to receive a certain balance due on the treasurer's books, have taken the same into consideration, and find, from a certificate from the treasurer, there is due to James Barton, the sum of three pounds three shillings and four-pence, with interest from the twenty-first of September, seventeen hundred and eighty-five, being an over payment for confiscated property. Your committee are of opinion that the said James Barton's administrators, Archibald Robinson and Thomas Barton, are the proper persons to receive the same, and therefore submit the following resolution:
