

Also an act relating to the alms or work house of Dorchester county, endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments.'

Which amendments being read the first, and by a special order the second time, were severally assented to.

Ordered, That the said bills be severally engrossed.

And an act to repeal an act, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, passed at December session 1815, chapter 48; endorsed 'will not pass.'

And delivered a resolution originated in and assented to by the senate, relative to the construction of certain parts of the act, entitled, An act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries and others, passed at December session 1827; chapter 117.

Which said resolution was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

The house then adjourned until this evening six o'clock.

MONDAY EVENING, SIX O'CLOCK,

March 2d, 1829.

The house met pursuant to adjournment. Were present the same members as in the morning.

Mr. King, chairman of the select committee appointed on the subject, reported a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to authorise the trustees of the poor of Charles county to purchase land and build a new poor's house.

On motion by Mr. King, the said bill was read the first, and by a special order the second time, and passed without amendment.

Mr. Gantt, chairman of the select committee appointed on the subject, reported a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Prince-George's county to convey certain lots therein mentioned in the town of Nottingham; which said bill was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Buskirk, entitled, An act for the benefit of John Hogeland and Jonathan Hogeland, late of Allegany county, and for other purposes, was taken up for reconsideration and again read; when,

Mr. Buskirk moved to amend the said bill, by appending at the end thereof, the following proviso:

'Provided, that nothing in this act contained shall operate to conclude any person or persons, or his, her or their legal representatives, from pleading the statute of limitations, or making any other defence which he, she or they may lawfully and rightfully do, against any claim or claims of the said Hogelands, or either of them, or the legal representatives of the said Hogelands, or either of them; And provided also,
