TUESDAY, March 10, 1829.

The house met. Were present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion by Mr. Gough, it was Ordered, That the speaker be authorised to appoint such additional clerks as may be necessary to expedite and complete the engrossment of bills.

On motion by Mr. Lee, the committee on internal improvement was discharged from the further consideration of all such parts of the memorial of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, and also of all such matters in relation to the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal Company, respectively referred to said committee, as have not yet been acted on by the said committee.

On motion by Mr. Rogerson, permission was granted by the house for the withdrawal of the memorial of Sybilla Carberry, of the District of Columbia, asking relief in the way of pension or otherwise, in consideration of the services of her late husband captain Henry Carberry, during the revolutionary war, and its accompanying papers and documents, presented by Mr. Lee to this house on the 10th instant.

On motion by Mr. McPherson, leave was granted by the house for the withdrawal of the petition of Tabitha Swearingen, of Frederick county, praying for a special act to enable her to hold certain slaves therein mentioned, and its accompanying papers and documents, presented by him to this house on the 7th of January last.

Mr. Wright of Dorchester, asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to fix the time of holding the county courts in the several counties comprehending the 4th judicial district of this state. And on his motion, it was Ordered, That a select committee of three members be appointed by the speaker to prepare and report said bill. Messrs. Wright of Dorchester, Done and Boyer, were appointed the said committee pursuant to the order.
