The message was then sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, *An act to lay out and bound the limits of the village of Greensborough, in Caroline county, endorsed "will pass."* Ordered to be engrossed. *Also the bill, entitled, An act to confirm the proceedings of Nicholas Norris, of Baltimore county, acting as a justice of the peace for said county in 1829 and 1830; endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;"* which amendment was read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also the bill, entitled, An act to repeal so much of the militia laws of this state as relate to parades, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were severally read and ordered to lie on the table.

Also the bill, entitled, An act to prevent fishing in Harford and Cecil counties on a certain day therein mentioned; also the bill, entitled, An act to divorce William W. Vickers and Rebecca Vickers, of Dorchester county, endorsed "will not pass."
