

Also the resolution extending the time for completing the records in the office of register of wills of Charles county; also the resolution directing the clerk of the council to transmit to the legislature annually, a statement of the disbursements and expenditures of the executive department for the previous year; also the resolution authorising the treasurer of the western shore to pay to Benjamin L. Gantt, for the use of Benjamin Duvall, Jr. of Prince-George's county, a sum of money therein mentioned; also the resolution in favour of Bell and James, severally endorsed "assented to." Ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered a bill originated in, and passed by the senate, entitled, *A further supplement to the act, passed at November session seventeen hundred and ninety-five, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate the subscribers thereto; which was read and referred to Messrs. Nicholas, Teackle and Claude.*

On motion by Mr. Nicholas, the bill reported by him entitled, *A second supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, passed at December session 1826, chapter 123, was taken up for consideration.*

On motion by Mr. Burchenal, the house was called, and the absent members sent for.

On motion by Mr. Burchenal, the house resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session during the absence of the door-keeper.

The bill reported by Mr. Biles, entitled, *An act to incorporate certain persons therein mentioned, for the purpose of establishing a school, called the Liberty Grove School of Cecil county, was taken up for consideration.*

When on motion by Mr. Gale, said bill was recommitted.

The bill, entitled, *An act empowering the commissioners of Harford county to build a bridge over Winter's Run in said county, at or near the place where the road leading from Gunpowder Neck to Bel-Air crosses said run.*

The bill, entitled, *A supplement to the act entitled, An act to authorise equitable assignees to sue in their own names.*

And the bill, from the senate, entitled, *An act relating to the police of the city of Baltimore.*

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

On motion by Mr. Hughlett, seconded by two other members (who voted in the majority) the vote of the house was reconsidered on the bill, entitled, *An additional supplement to*
