Also the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company for the purpose of cutting and making a canal between the river Delaware and the Chesapeake bay; also the bill, entitled, An act to provide for building a bridge over the Patapsco Falls at or near the Thistle Factory, severally endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were severally read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed. Also the resolution in favour of John J. Jacobs, a revolutionary officer; also the resolution relating to the common free school fund; also the resolution relating to the county schools fund; and the resolution directing the governor and council to appoint two planters from each of the six most extensive tobacco growing counties in the state, and two shippers of tobacco, to examine into the condition of the public tobacco warehouses, and the different scites on the basin, severally endorsed "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act passed at December session 1829, chapter 168,

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, and passed.

Mr. Stewart reported a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Caleb Stewart and Richard Mace, of Anne-Arundel county.

And Mr. Biles, from the committee, reported a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate certain persons therein mentioned, for the purpose of establishing a school, called the Liberty Grove School, in Cecil county; which said bills were severally read the first, and by special order the second time, and passed.

The preamble and resolutions offered by Mr. Ely on the 9th inst. relative to the chancery records, was taken up for consideration;
