The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, *An act for the relief of Caleb Stewart and Richard Mace, of Anne-Arundel county; also the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate certain persons therein mentioned, for the purpose of establishing a school called The Liberty Grove School, in Cecil county; also the bill, entitled, An act to brand mackerel fish, and to reduce the rate of inspecting the same, in the city of Baltimore; also the bill, entitled, An act to reduce the rates of inspecting and guaging in this state; also an act to authorise and empower commissioners to open and extend the breadth of an alley in Westminster, in Frederick county; also the bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act passed at December session 1829, chapter 168; also the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the recording of a deed therein mentioned; also the bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to regulate the removal of proceedings in criminal cases, and to make certain changes in the constitution and form of government for that purpose; also the resolutions in favour of Maria Gambrill, Elizabeth Dawkins, Samuel Morton, Stephen Hafley, and Gassaway Pindell; also the resolutions relative to the county school funds, were sent to the senate.*

Mr. Blanchard, chaplain of the senate, each, the sum of one hundred dollars, as a compensation for their respective services during the present session.
