The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, An act, empowering the commissioners of Harford county to build a bridge over Winters's Run in said county, at or near the place where the road leading from Gunpowder Neck to Bell Air crosses said run; also the bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company under the name of The Nottingham Library Company, passed at December session 1815, chapter 144, severally endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. Also the bill, entitled, An act to extend the time of taking appeals from the chancery court in a certain case therein mentioned; also the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Frederick and Emmitsburg turnpike road company, severally endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendments were severally read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed. Also the bill entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act empowering the levy courts of Harford and Baltimore counties, to build a bridge over the Little Gunpowder Falls at the Rock Ford; also the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the issuing of attachments by justices of the peace for the recovery of small debts, severally endorsed "will not pass." Also the resolution in favour of Thomas Osborn, late sheriff and collector of Prince-George's county; also the resolution in favour of Jonas Green; also the resolution in favour of Martin Bourke of Washington county; also the resolution relative to the Chesapeake and Ohio canal company. severally endorsed "assented to" and ordered to be engrossed. And delivered a resolution originated in and passed by the senate, requesting the executive to cause the flag to be hoisted on the dome of the state house, and a national salute to be fired at sun-rise, noon, and at sun-set, on Tuesday next the 22nd day of February, in commemoration of the birth of the illustrious Washington; which was read and referred to Messrs. Brewer, M·Mahon and Dickinson.
