

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry poor persons in the several counties therein mentioned, and the resolution in favour of Isaac Hooper of Calvert county, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Bell presented the petition of sundry citizens of Somerset and Worcester counties, praying for the appointment of inspectors and measurers of lumber and fire-wood for the town of Salisbury and Longtank; which was read and referred to Messrs. Bell, Parker, Ballard, Mitchell and Teackle.

Mr. Thomas of Queen-Anne's presented the petition of sundry citizens of Queen Anne's county, praying for the passage of a law to encourage the destruction of crows in said county; which was read and referred to Messrs. Thomas of Queen Anne's, Brown of Queen Anne's and Tilghman.

Mr. Tilghman from the committee on lotteries, made an unfavourable report on the petition of sundry inhabitants of Montgomery county, praying to be authorised to raise a fund by the drawing of a lottery.

Which was twice read and concurred in.

Mr. Hicks submitted the following message:

By the House of Delegates,

Which was twice read, assented to, and with the bill therein mentioned, sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Montgomery, leave was given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act relating to the commissioners of Harford and Baltimore counties, and for other purposes. Ordered, That Messrs. Montgomery, Moores and Ely, report the same.

Mr. Rogerson from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made a favourable report upon the order of the house to inquire into the propriety of placing Catherine Plane, (the widow of Jacob Plane) on the pension list, accompanied with the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Catherine Plane,
