The said bill was then returned to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Hunt, the house reconsidered their vote on the bill from the senate entitled, An act to divorce Richard Gittings and Elizabeth Gittings of Baltimore county.

The said bill was then read, passed, and returned to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Burchenal, Ordered, That the printer for the session shall be considered the printer for the house until another shall be appointed at the next session.

Mr. Merrick from the committee on grievances and courts of justice made an unfavourable report upon the petition of Richard Duvall, of Prince-George's county praying relief therein specified.

Which was twice read and concurred in.

Mr. Rogerson submitted the following resolution; which was read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Resolved, That the register of the land office for the western shore, issue to Susanna Brewer, widow of Thomas Brewer, a revolutionary soldier, a common warrant for fifty acres of vacant land, lying to the westward of Fort Cumberland, in Allegany county, and to issue a patent for the said quantity of acres of land, upon the return of the survey thereof duly returned, without requiring payment, or proof of payment, or any composition money therefor.

Mr. Willson submitted the following message; which was read, assented to, and sent to the senate.
