Mr. Steele submitted the following resolution; which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and assented to.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland. That the treasurer of the western shore pay to George G. Brewer chief clerk of the house of delegates, and Louis Gassaway chief clerk of the senate, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the several amounts of such accounts as may from time to time, be presented to him by said clerks, for the newspapers they may have furnished for the use of the members of their respective houses, in accordance with the orders adopted for that purpose, by said houses.

On motion by Mr. Brown of Queen Anne's, Ordered, That the door-keeper of this house be directed forthwith to collect the property belonging to the state, that has been taken from the house for the use of the members and officers thereof. And be it further ordered, That the said door-keeper be and he is hereby required to make out and return, under oath, an inventory of all the public furniture under his care, and also of the balance of the stationary which shall be on hand at the close of the present session, and report the same to the next house of delegates.
