The said bill was then returned to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, An act to repeal an act of assembly, entitled, An act to limit the time for taking appeals from magistrate's judgments, passed at December session 1829, chapter 236, and for other purposes, endorsed, "will not pass." Also resolutions in favour of Isaac Hooper, of Calvert county, and Catharine Plane, of the city of Annapolis, severally endorsed, "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed. And delivered a bill, originated in, and passed by the senate, entitled, An act vesting certain powers in the orphans court of Montgomery county; which was read and referred to Messrs. Harding, Gittings and Willson. Also a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act of December session 1827, chapter 117, entitled, An act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries, and others; which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Tilghman, from the committee on ways and means, made a favourable report upon said bill.

The said bill was then read the first, and by special order the second time, passed, and returned to the senate.

Mr. Harding, from the select committee, made a favourable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, An act vesting certain powers in the orphans court of Montgomery county.
