

Amendment proposed.

Strike out in the 5th line, from the word "delay," to the word "Easton," in the 7th line, and insert the following: "In two newspapers printed in the city of Baltimore, and in one newspaper in each of the counties in which a newspaper is printed in this state."

Which amendment was twice read, and assented to.

The said resolution was then read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to as amended, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Blakistone submitted the following message; which was read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

By the House of Delegates,

February 24th, 1831.

The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass?
