

tend beyond an adjournment. He shall appoint all conferees and committees, unless otherwise directed by the House; and may admit stenographers willing to take down the debates, and assign them such places on the floor, or elsewhere, to effect their object, as shall not interfere with the business or convenience of the House.

4th. In case of any disturbance or disorderly conduct in the gallery or lobby, the Speaker, (or chairman of the committee of the whole house,) shall have power to order the same to be cleared.

5th. No person shall be admitted within the bar of the House, but members of the Executive and Judiciary departments, members of the Senate, former members of the Legislature, and such other persons as may be invited by the Speaker.

OF THE ORDER OF BUSINESS.

6th. The Clerk of the House shall, within six days from the commencement of the session, place in the hands of the Speaker, a correct list of all bills, resolutions and reports, which originated in this House, and were referred from the preceding to the succeeding session.

7th. Immediately after the reading of the proceedings of the preceding day, the clerk shall announce the bills ready for a second reading, and the orders of the day; after which, the following order of proceeding shall be observed, viz:

The presentation and disposition of petitions, memorials, applications, or other papers.

Orders and leaves to introduce bills and resolutions, will be received.

Reports of standing committees, will be in order.

Reports of select committees, will be in order

Bills reported for a first reading, will then be in order.
