

Whereupon, it was resolved, That General James Thomas, be, and he is hereby declared to be duly elected Governor of the state of Maryland, for the ensuing year.

The clerk of the senate returned the resolution relative to forwarding to the editors of papers, and public journals in this state, printed copies of the daly proceedings of the Senate and House of Delegates, endorsed assented to, ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Blakistone submitted the following message, which was read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

By the House of Delegates, Jan. 7th, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate.

The Honourable James Thomas' of Saint Mary's county, having been elected Governor of Maryland, we propose that a joint letter be addressed to him by the president of the senate and the speaker of this house, notifying him of his election, and requesting his attendance at the seat of government, to qualify agreeably to the constitution and form of government of this state, and that the same be forwarded by express.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the senate delivered the following message:

January 7th, 1833.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received and concur in your message proposing that the president of the senate and the speaker of your honourable body announce by letter, to the honourable James Thomas, his election as Governor of this state, and request his attendance at the seat of government; and that the communication be transmitted by express.
