Gentlemen of the Senate.

We propose with the concurrence of your honorable body to proceed this day at twelve o'clock, to the election of a Council to the Governor, and have nominated Messrs. Robert W. Bowie, of Prince Georges county, Samuel Turner, of Calvert county, Thomas C. Worthington, of Frederick county, William Potter, of Caroline county, and John S. Martin, of Worcester county.

We have appointed Messrs. Gantt and Hope, to count the ballots and report the result.

Ordered, That the report of the committee on Ways and Means upon the report of the select committee to which was referred at the last session of the General Assembly the memorials and petitions of a great number of citizens of different counties, praying the establishment of a financial institution to be founded upon the invested moneys of the Treasury, for the supply of revenue, and the general convenience and benefit; together with the bill reported by the select committee which were referred to the consideration of this Legislature, be referred to the select committee appointed upon that subject at the present session.

Mr. Bruce obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An act extending the time for taking the bond of the Sheriff of Allegany county; ordered, that Messrs. Bruce, Lantz and Slicer, report the same.

Mr. Compton obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act giving a compensation to Jurors in cases of forcible entry and detainer; ordered, that Messrs. Compton, Gantt, and Wright of Queen Ann's, report the same.
