

WEDNESDAY, January 9th, 1833.

The house met;—present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, An act extending the time for taking the bond of the Sheriff of Allegany county; and the resolution in favor of Benjamin Goddard, of Prince Georges county,

Were sent to the Senate.

Mr. Wright, of Dorchester, presented a petition of Sarah Block, of Dorchester county, praying an act may pass to divorce her, *a mensa et thoro*, from her husband, Arthur M. Block;

Which was read, and referred to the committee on Divorces.

Mr. Johnson presented a memorial of John McElroy, President of St. John's Literary Institution in Fredericktown, praying a donation from the state;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Education.

Mr. Hammond presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying for certain alterations in the constitution of Maryland;

Which was read and referred to the select committee appointed on the constitution.

And Mr. Teackle presented a petition of sundry citizens of Somerset county, praying that the Court House may be built on the old lot, where the former one stood;

Which was read and referred to the select committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Pratt obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, An act to provide for the completion of the records in the office of the Register of Wills of Prince Georges' County.

Ordered, That Messrs. Pratt, Gantt and Duvall, of Prince Georges county, report the same.

Mr. Hammond obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Savings' Institution of Emmittsburg, in Frederick county.

Ordered, That Messrs. Hammond, Unkefer and Johnson, report the same.

Mr. Lantz obtained leave to bring in a bill incorporating a company in Allegany county, to make a Turnpike road from some point at or near Alexander Smith's Ford, on the north branch of Potomac, leading westwardly to some
