In pursuance whereof, the Speaker appointed Messrs. Heard, Mudd, and Duvall of Prince Georges, the committee.

On motion by Mr. Duvall, of Prince Georges, he was excused from serving on said committee.

The Speaker thereupon appointed Mr. White, in lieu of Mr. Duvall.

On motion by Mr Jones,

Ordered, That the committee on military pensions and revolutionary claims, be instructed to inquire into the propriety of placing on the pension roll, Levin Willin, senior, of Somerset county, a soldier of the revolution, who was wounded on board of the barge "Protector," commanded by Capt. Zedekiah Waley, in the revolutionary war.

The Speaker laid before the house a communication from the Clerk of Worcester County Court, containing a copy of the record of the proceedings had in the case of George Carey vs. Nancy Carey, for a divorce; which was read and referred to the committee on Divorces.

Mr. Compton, chairman of the committee on Divorces, made unfavorable reports upon the petitions of Isaac Nixon of Allegany county, Lucinda Rodgers, of Allegany county, Ezekiel Boring, of Baltimore county, and Mary Edmonds, of Washington county, severally praying to be divorced.

Which were severally read.
