

The bill reported by Mr. Milbourne, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Presbyterian church in Salisbury, in Worcester county, passed at December session, 1830, chapter 102.

And the bill reported by Mr. Cottman, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, an act to amend the Constitution and form of Government, as it relates to the division of Somerset county, into election districts, passed at December session 1831.

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

The resolution in favour of John Hutchinson, of Dorchester county, was taken up for consideration, read the second time and assented to.

On motion by Mr. Ellicott,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the House, the petitions of sundry citizens of Anne Arundel and Prince George's counties, praying the location of a Rail Road from Baltimore to the city of Washington, presented at the last session.

The Clerk of the Senate delivered the following message:—
