And the resolution in favour of John Hutchison, of Dorchester county; were sent to the Senate.

Also, presented a petition of George Douglass, and George M. Gill, praying the passage of an act to authorise the Mayor and city Council of Baltimore, to widen a part of Strawberry Alley, in said city, which was read, and referred to Messrs. Jenkins, Harper and Ely.

Also, presented a petition of Henry McEldery, and others, praying the passage of an act to reduce the width of a part of Harford street, in the city of Baltimore, which was read and referred to Messrs. Jenkins, Harper and Holmes.

And presented a petition of Anthony Kennedy of Baltimore county, praying that an act may pass, authorising him to bring from the State of Virginia, into this State, certain negro slaves therein mentioned, which was read and referred to the standing committee appointed on the subject of the coloured population of this State.
