The unfavourable report of the committee on divorces, to whom was referred the petition of Lucinda Rogers, of Allegany county, praying to be divorced, was taken up for consideration, and read the second time.

Mr. Louthan offered as a substitute for said report, a bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Lucinda Rogers, of Allegany county,

On motion by Mr. Turner, said report and substitute were ordered to lie on the table.

The favourable reports of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, upon the petition of Barbara Reily, of the District of Columbia, (widow of the late Major William Riley;)

Also, the petition of Doctor Ennals Martin, of Talbot county, a surgeons mate, during the Revolutionary War, were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time; the reports concurred in, and the resolutions therein contained, severally assented to.

The bill reported by Mr. Nicols, entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act to incorporate the Savings Institution of Dorchester county, was taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.
