

Mr. White from the committee on Internal Improvement, reported a bill, entitled, A further supplement to the Act, entitled An act to promote Internal Improvement by the construction of a rail road from Baltimore, to the city of Washington, passed at December session 1830; and,

Mr. Ely reported a bill entitled, An act to amend certain acts therein mentioned, and for other purposes;

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Gantt, chairman of the committee on inspections, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, An act supplementary to an act regulating the inspection of green hides, and skins, in the city of Baltimore.

Which was read.

Mr. Harper from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, An act to incorporate the Franklin Savings Company of Baltimore;

Which was read.

The bill reported by Mr. Holmes, entitled, An act to repeal an act entitled, an act to abolish imprisonment for debt on certain judgments rendered by Justices of the Peace, passed at December session 1830, chapter 155; was taken up for consideration, and read the second time.

Mr. Jones moved to recommit the bill to the committee that reported it, with instructions to report a bill, which should authorize imprisonment for one week, on all writs of *capias ad satisfaciendum*, where the amount of the judgment should not exceed thirty dollars, and where the defendant shall neglect or refuse, otherwise to satisfy such judgment, provided that nothing in the law contemplated to be passed, shall be construed to deprive the debtor of his rights and privileges, under the insolvent law of this state.

Mr. Milbourne moved to lay the bill and order on the table.

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred, and was put on the motion of Mr. Jones, to recommit the bill with instructions.

Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, shall the said bill pass;

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Holmes, the yeas and nays were ordered, and appeared as follows.
