On motion by Mr. Jenkins, said bill was amended, by inserting after the word "meeting," in the fourth section, second line, the words "being the property of."

On motion by Mr. Teackle, said bill was further amended by striking out in the second line of the fifth section, the word "fifty," and inserting in lieu thereof, the words "twenty-five."

The said bill was then read the second time, as amended, and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Jenkins, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, an act to provide for the public printing of the State, passed December session 1831, chapter 303, was taken up for consideration.

When on motion by Mr. Brewer, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Roberts, entitled, an act for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Queen Anne's county, was taken up for consideration;

When on motion by Mr. Roberts, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Wright, of Dorchester, entitled, an act to cause the owners of mills at or near to the public roads, in Dorchester county, to erect side railings on bridges, which they may have placed, or shall hereafter place on said roads, was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Wright, of Queen Anne's, moved to amend said bill, by striking out in the third line of the first section, the words "Dorchester county," and insert in lieu thereof, the words "this State."

Mr. Jenkins, moved to lay the bill on the table.

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Ely, the bill reported by him entitled, an act to amend certain acts therein mentioned, and for other purposes, was taken up for consideration, read the second time by special order, and passed.

Mr. Blakistone obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to provide for the preservation of wild fowl, in the Potomac river, and its tributaries.

Ordered, That Messrs. Blakistone, Edelen and Rogerson, report the same.
