

1826 inclusive, as directed by a resolution of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed December session 1831, No. 125.

On motion by Mr. Blakistone,

Ordered, That the committee on grievances and courts of justice, inquire into the propriety of having such of the record books of the provincial court and of the court of Appeals as are in a state of decay, transcribed so as to preserve entire the judicial history of this State.

Mr. Pratt obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act to authorise the exchange of certain real property therein mentioned.

Ordered, That Messrs. Pratt, Gantt and Edelen, report the same.

Mr. Hollman obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act to incorporate the Hagerstown Savings Institution in Washington county.

Ordered, That Messrs. Hollman, Mann and Grove, report the same.

Mr. Johns obtained leave to bring in a bill, to change the name of James Michael, of Harford county, to that of James Johnson.

Ordered, That Messrs. Johns, Sutton and Hope, report the same.

On motion by Mr. Brewer,

Ordered, That the committee on claims, be instructed to pay to William McNeir, three hundred dollars on his account for executing the printing of the Senate of the present session.

Mr. Teackle, chairman of the committee on ways and means, submitted the following resolution:

By the House of Delegates,  
January 19th, 1833.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he hereby is required to carry to the credit of the Tobacco Warehouse sinking fund, the sum of twelve thousand, five hundred and sixty three dollars and seventy cents, and to invest the same in some productive public stock, on the best obtainable terms, to be applied towards the redemption of the loan of forty eight thousand dollars, negotiated in pursuance of chapter two hundred and fifty-two, of eighteen hundred and twenty-six.
