Mr. Harris reported a bill, entitled, An act to repeal an act, entitled, An act for the relief of Joseph Stone, and others, securities of William Williams, late Sheriff and Collector of St. Mary's county, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 210, and for other purposes.

Mr. Bourke, from the committee on Divorces, reported a bill, entitled, An act to divorce Juliana Donaldson from her husband William B. Donaldson.

Mr Compton reported a bill, entitled, An act to authorize the conveyance of certain real estate therein mentioned.

Mr. Brewer reported a bill, entitled, An act for the extension and renewal of the charter of the Farmer's Bank of Maryland, and Branches, and for other purposes.

And, Mr. White, from the committee on Internal Improvement, reported a bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to promote Internal Improvement by the construction of a Rail Road from Baltimore to the city of Washington, passed at December session, 1830.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The house then adjourned until Monday morning ten o'clock.

MONDAY, January 21st, 1833.

The house met; present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The resolution in favour of Alexander Robertson, of Allegany county, was sent to the Senate.
