Mr. Heard presented a petition of Shippers and Agents for receiving and selling tobacco in the city of Baltimore, praying that power may be given to the inspectors of the several warehouses, to prevent the wharves being blocked up, and incumbered by wood and other objects unconnected with the operations of said warehouses; which was read and referred to Messrs. Heard, Gantt and Harper.

Mr. Hollman presented a petition of sundry citizens of Hagerstown, in Washington county, praying that a charter may be granted them for a Savings Institution; which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Mann presented a petition of John Barnhison, of Washington county, praying to be placed on the pension list of said county; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessments.

Mr. Wright, of Queen Anne's, presented a petition of John Whitely, of Queen Anne's county, praying a divorce from his wife Rebecca Whitely; which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Compton presented a petition of Jason Jones, of Anne Arundel county, a revolutionary soldier, praying to be placed on the pension roll; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims;

And, Mr. Jenkins presented a petition of A. G. Cole and Co. and others, dealers in lumber in the city of Baltimore, counter to the petition of Thomas L. Savin and others, relative to the inspection of lumber; which was read and referred to the committee on inspections.

The Speaker laid before the house a report of the Orphans Court of Somerset county, relative to their free school fund for 1832; which was read and referred to the committee on education.

The clerk of the Senate delivered a report of the Trustees, of Washington Academy, in Somerset county, endorsed, "referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates; which was read and referred to the committee on education;
