

TUESDAY, January 22nd, 1833.

The house met;—present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, An act to provide for the completion of the records in the office of Register of Wills of Prince George's county;

The bill entitled, An act to amend the act, entitled, an act to make valid the instrument of writing therein mentioned;

The bill entitled, an act for the relief Jacob Harris;

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, An act to provide for the public printing of the State, passed December session 1831, chapter 303;

The bill entitled, an act to authorize the Mayor and city Council of Baltimore, to alter the width of a part of Canal, formerly Harford street, of a part of Spring street, of a part of Strawberry Alley and to close Russel Lane;

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Block, of Dorchester county, from her husband Arthur M. Block, of the city of Baltimore;

And the message adopted by this house on yesterday, proposing the appointment of a joint committee of both houses, to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to lay off the State in Congressional Districts; were sent to the Senate.

The bill from the Senate, entitled, an act supplementary to an act regulating the inspection of green hides and skins, in the city of Baltimore, was returned to the Senate.

Mr. Nicols presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Dorchester county, praying the passage of a law, to incorporate a society to be styled the Independent Order of Odd Fellows; which was read and referred to Messrs. Nicols, Harper, and Pratt.

Mr. Harper presented a memorial of the President and Managers of the Washington Monument, praying a further appropriation, which was read and referred to Messrs. Harper, Bourke and Compton.

Mr. Weist presented a petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying for an act, authorizing the Commissioners of said county, to levy a sum of money to build a stone bridge across Antietam creek, at Hess's old burnt mill, on the road from Williamsport to Pleasant Valley; which was read and referred to Messrs. Weist, Hollman and Mann.

And Mr. Charles presented a petition of sundry citizens of Caroline county, praying to be authorized to open a road
