

and to form a landing therein mentioned which was read and referred to Messrs. Charles, Richardson, of Caroline, and Jump.

Mr. Wright, of Dorchester, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to authorize the Levy court of Dorchester county, to appoint two Constables in the Town of Cambridge, in said county.

Ordered, That Messrs. Wright, of Dorchester, Richardson, of Dorchester, and Travers, report the same.

Mr Jenkins submitted the following preamble and order; which was twice read and adopted.

Whereas, it appears by the Treasurer's reports for the years 1831 and 1832, that there was received into the Treasury of the State, through the agency of Baltimore city court, upwards of fifty thousand dollars in the said two years, viz: in the year 1831 \$25,867 11, and in the year 1832 \$27,017 35.

And, Whereas, it appears by the annual accounts rendered by the Register of the city of Baltimore, to the Mayor and city Council of Baltimore, that the taxes imposed upon the people of the said city, for the support of the said court, have amounted in the average to about twelve thousand dollars per annum.

And, Whereas, the principal and almost the exclusive duties of the said court, are to enforce the penal and revenue laws of the State of Maryland in the city of Baltimore, and the State should therefore contribute proportionately; to the necessary expenses of the said court.

And, Whereas, at present the State pays annually but two thousand four hundred dollars towards the said expenses, viz: The salary of the Chief Judge—whilst the city of Baltimore, as herein before recited, pays about twelve thousand dollars per annum, over and above all that is received to the said city therefrom. Therefore,

Ordered, That the committee on grievances and courts of justice, be instructed to inquire into the propriety of providing by law, for the payment of the salaries of the associate Judges of Baltimore city court, out of the Treasury of the State.
