

The bill reported by Mr. Harris, entitled, an act to repeal an act, entitled, an act for the relief of Joseph Stone, and others, securities of William Williams, late sheriff and collector of Saint Mary's county, passed at December session 1831, chapter 210, and for other purposes, was taken for up consideration;

The bill reported by Mr. White, from the committee on Internal Improvement, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act to promote Internal Improvement by the construction of a Rail Road from Baltimore to the city of Washington, passed December session, 1830, was taken up for consideration;

When on motion by Mr. Ely said bill was ordered to lie on the table;

The report of the committee appointed by the order of the House of Delegates, to examine the State Tobacco warehouses in the city of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and concurred in.

The report of the select committee, to whom was referred so much of the Executive message, as relates to the inspection of tobacco, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolutions therein contained, assented to.

Mr. Johnson presented a petition of sundry citizens of Frederick and Baltimore counties, praying that the said counties may be so divided, that three counties may be made thereof;

And Mr. Turner presented a remonstrance of the delegates from Baltimore county, at the late convention held in Baltimore, on the subject of reform, against the division of Frederick and Baltimore counties;

Which were severally read, and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.
