

FRIDAY, January 25th, 1833.

The House met; present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorize the Levy Court of Dorchester county, to purchase a piece of land for the repairs of a public causeway in said county; the bill, entitled, An act to change the name of James Michael, of Harford county, to James Johnson; and the resolution in favor of James Wats, of Dorchester county, were sent to the Senate.

Mr. Blakistone submitted the following message:

By the House of Delegates,  
January 25, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We propose, with your concurrence, to proceed this day, at half past 11 o'clock, to the election of a Senator, to represent this State in the Congress of the United States, for the term of six years, from and after the fourth day of March next. Joseph Kent, of Prince George's County, is put in nomination on the part of this House; and we have appointed Messrs Blakistone and Ellicott, to join such gentlemen as shall be named by your honorable body, to count the ballots and report the result.
