

General Assembly of the State, and for other purposes; which was read, and,

On motion by Mr. Bourke, said report and substitute were laid on the table.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, the bill reported by Mr. Brewer, entitled, an act for the extension and renewal of the Charter of the Farmers Bank of Maryland, and its branches, and for other purposes; was referred to the committee on ways and means.

The clerk of the Senate delivered the following message:

By the Senate,

January 25th, 1833.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message, proposing to go into the election of United States Senator this day at half past one o'clock P. M., and concur therein. No person has been put in nomination by the senate in addition to the gentlemen named in your message; we have appointed Messrs. Claude and Hughlett, to join the gentlemen named by you, to count the ballots and report the result.

Which was read.

On motion by Mr. Pratt, the house proceeded to ballot for a Senator to represent this state in the Senate of the United State;

The ballot box being prepared, the ballots were deposited therein, sealed up, and delivered to the committee of the House of Delegates, appointed to meet the committee of the Senate, to count the ballots, who retired to the conference room, and after some time, returned and reported that there were eighty-six votes taken, of which number Joseph Kent, esq. received sixty one votes, and Samuel Smith, esq. received twenty-five votes; whereupon,

Resolved, That Joseph Kent, esq: be, and he is hereby declared to be, a Senator, to represent this State, in the Senate of the United States.

Mr. Evans reported a bill, entitled, a further supplement to an act, empowering and directing the commissioners of Cecil county, to build two fire proof offices for the use of the Clerk and Register of Wills, for the safe keeping of the records, appertaining to their respective offices in the town of Elkton;

And Mr. Ely reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Patapsco Savings Institution at Ellicotts mills; which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table;
