Grove, Mann and Weast;

Also, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Washington county praying that commissioners may be appointed to lay off an additional district in said county; which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Gantt presented a petition of John M. Hepburn, administrator de bonis non of John Hepburn deceased, praying a re-reference of his claim on the State, to the Chancellor of Maryland, with the accompanying documents, with the right of appeal, &c.; which was read and referred to Messrs. Gantt, Cottman, Ely, Johnson and Harding;

And Mr. Nicols presented a memorial of Nathaniel Potter and others, of the Medical Faculty of the State of Maryland, praying relief, and that a committee may be appointed to visit the University for the purpose therein prayed; which was read and referred to Messrs. Nicols, Pratt, Johnson, Harris and Jenkins.
