

The question then recurred, and was put on the adoption of the order.

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Nicols, from the select committee, appointed on the memorial of Nathaniel Potter and others, of the Medical Faculty, of the State of Maryland, delivered the following report:

The committee respectfully report, that they have examined the memorial of the petitioners, and are of opinion that a committee of five, should be appointed to examine into the situation of the Medical University at Baltimore, and do therefore submit the following order:

J. NICOLS, Ch'n.

Ordered, That Messrs. Nicols, Pratt, Willson, Harris and Unkafer, be and they are hereby appointed a committee to proceed to Baltimore and examine into the situation of the Medical University at that place, and report to this house.

Which was read the first and second time by special order, and rejected;

On motion by Mr. Harper, the house again resolved itself into a committee of the whole house, and resumed the consideration of the unfinished order of Thursday, being the report of the joint committee of the Legislature, on the South Carolina Ordinance, and the substitute proposed by Mr. Merrick, and after some time spent therein, the Speaker resumed the chair; when Mr. Blakistone the chairman, reported, that the said committee had, according to order, had the said report and substitute, again under consideration, and having made some progress therein, directed him to ask leave to sit again on Monday week next; which leave was granted by the house.

The house then adjourned until Monday morning ten o'clock.

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MONDAY, January 28th, 1833.

The house met; present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to cause the owners of mills at or near to the public roads in Dorchester and Allegany counties, to erect side railings on bridges which they may have placed, or shall hereafter place on said roads;

And the resolution in favour of Bernard Thompson, a revolutionary soldier were sent to the Senate.
