

William Williams, late sheriff and collector of Saint Mary's county, passed at December session 1831, chapter 210, and for other purposes;

The bill, entitled, a further supplement to an act empowering and directing the commissioners of Cecil county, to build two fire proof offices for the use of the Clerk and Register of wills, for the safe keeping of the records appertaining to their respective offices, in the town of Elkton;

And the bill, entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Barrett and her husband Patrick Barrett, of Baltimore county; were sent to the Senate.

Mr. Gantt submitted the following message; which was read, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

By the House of Delegates,

January 29th, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

This being the day fixed by previous arrangement for the election of Bank Directors on the part of the State, we propose with your concurrence, to proceed at 12 o'clock to day with said election. The following persons are nominated by this house.

For the Mechanic's Bank of Baltimore—Francis Neal, and Ebenezer Finley.

For the Farmers Bank of Maryland—Nicholas Brewer, jr. and George Wells.

For the Branch Bank of the Farmers Bank of Md. at Easton—James Price and Theodore R. Lockerman.

For the Elkton Bank—Adam Whan.

For the Hagerstown Bank—Alexander Neill and John Walgamot.

For the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Baltimore—Allen Griffith.

And we have appointed Messrs. Gantt and Johns, to join such gentlemen as may be named by your honourable body to count the ballots and report the result.
