

Also, the bill entitled, An act to change the name of James Michael, of Harford county. to James Johnson, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;

Which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

And, delivered a bill originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, An act for the completion of a certain trust therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

On motion by Mr. Heard, leave of absence was granted to Mr. Blakistone for a few days.

The bill reported by Mr. Turner, entitled, An act to prevent partiality in sales by auction of deceased persons estates, was taken up for consideration;

On motion by Mr. Nicols, the preamble to said bill was stricken out.

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Grove, entitled, An act to incorporate the town of Sharpsburgh and Millers Addition to Sharpsburgh.

The bill reported by Mr. Ely, entitled An act to authorize the recording of certain deeds therein mentioned, and for other purposes;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

And, the bill reported by Mr. Mann, entitled, An act to repeal an act to declare certain trespasses felony, and for other purposes, passed at December session 1826, chapter 260, so far as relates to Washington county;

The house then adjourned until to morrow morning ten o'clock.

FRIDAY, February 1st, 1833.
