Mr. Moores, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An act to change all such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state, as relate to the appointment of Registers of Wills, and clerks of the county courts of this state?

Ordered, That Messrs. Moores, Long, Ely, Pratt and Scott report the same.
