

Mr. Jones of Somerset, submitted the following order, which was read and adopted.

Ordered, That the Governor and Council be respectfully requested to furnish this house with all the information in their possession relative to the number of deaf and dumb in the several counties of this state—whether the Levy Courts and Commissioners in the several counties have complied annually with the requisition of the law of 1827. Also the number that now remain at the institution in Philadelphia, and from what part of the state, and the date of admission.

Mr. Day, submitted the following resolution, which was read the first and second time by special order, and assented to.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Isaac G. Magruder, collector of Prince George's county, have until the first day of March next, to collect and pay into the treasury, five hundred and twelve dollars and sixty-six cents, being the quota of said county, to the colonization fund for the year 1833.

Mr. Harris submitted the following resolution;

Which was read the first and second time by special order and assented to.

Resolved by the General Asssmbly of Maryland, That the Librarian be, and he is hereby authorised to furnish two bound copies of the Laws of this State, from the year 1818 to the present time; one copy to be left at the office of the Clerk of St. Mary's county, for the use of the court thereof, the other to be left at the Registers of Wills' office, for the use of the Orphans' Court of said county.

Mr. Nicols, submitted the following message:
