Mr. Unkefer presented a petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying for a supplement to an act, entitled, An act to alter and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relates to the division of Frederick county, into election districts, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 112;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Unkefer, Pal-

mer and Sifford.

The Speaker laid before the House a report from the Treasurer of the western shore, in obedience to an order of the House of Delegates of the 2d January inst.

Which was read and ordered to lie on the table;
