

On motion of Mr. Snowden,

Ordered, That so much of the Governor's Message, as relates to the transmission of Books and other documents to the different states, be referred to a select committee of five

The Speaker appointed Messrs. Snowden, Handy, Purnell, Gantt and Palmer, to constitute the said committee.

On motion by Mr Jones of Somerset,

Ordered, That a select committee of five be appointed to examine the documents accompanying the Governor's Message for the purpose of ascertaining whether any and what portion should be printed.

The Spaker appointed Messrs. Jones of Somerset, Wilson, Bruff, Heard and Ely, to constitute the said committee.

On motion by Mr. Snowden,

Ordered, That so much of the Governor's Message as relates to the subject of Internal Improvement, be referred to the standing committee on that subject.

On motion by Mr. Ely,

Ordered, That so much of the Executive Message as relates to the communication from the Governor of the state of Connecticut, with the resolutions of the General Assembly of that state, on the subject of the Tariff—be referred to the committee on manufactures.

The house according to the order of the day, took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Handy, entitled, an act concerning Guardians and Wards.

When the same was read a second time and passed.

The house then adjourned until Monday morning ten o'clock.

MONDAY, January 6th, 1834.
