Ordered, That Messrs. Ely, Jones of Balt., Hillen, Moores and Merrick, report the same.

Mr. Lantz, obtained leave to bring in a bill, or otherwise to provide for placing Jane Roberts, the widow of William Roberts, late of Allegany county, deceased, on the pension list of the state of Maryland.

Ordered, That the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims report the same.

Mr. Sellman, submitted the following resolution
