Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

On motion by Mr. Sellman,

Ordered. That so much of the Governor's Message, as relates to the several proposals for furnishing stationary for the public use, be referred to the committee on claims.

On motion by Mr. Spencer,

Ordered, That the treasurer of the Western Shore, report to this house, a statement of the aggregate cost of public printing, for each year, from the year 1823, to the present time, specifying the amount paid for printing the journal—the ordinary printing for the house, as well as for printing the laws, and to whom paid.

On motion by Mr. Willson,

Ordered, That the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, be instructed to inquire into the expediency of striking the name of Mrs. Babara Riley, widow of Major William Riley, late of the district of Columbia, from the pension list of the state.

The clerk of the senate delivered the following message,

By the Senate, Jan. 6th, 1834.
