5. Letter from his Excellency, Gov. Scott of Mississippi, in relation to the amendments of the Constitution of the United States.

6. Letter from his Excellency the Governor of Connecticut, in relation to certain resolutions therein mentioned.

7 & 8. Communication from their Excellencies, Governors of New York and New Hampshire, relating to the re-organization of the militia of the U. S.
