

bill was ordered to lie on the table, and made the order of the day for Monday the 13th inst.

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Peregoy, entitled, an Act to incorporate the Carroll Beneficial Society of Baltimore.

On motion by Mr. Bruff, the bill was amended by striking out the following words in the 7th section;

“And, which may be necessary to the corporation herein and hereby constituted and erected.”

Mr. Franklin Smith moved to amend the bill by striking out after the words, “And be it enacted,” in the 8th section, to the end of the section, and inserting in lieu thereof, these words, “That each member of the said society shall, in his individual capacity, be answerable for any losses, deficiencies or failures of the joint funds of the said society.”

Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Handy, the bill was further amended by adding at the end of the 9th section, the following proviso:

“Provided, nevertheless, that no such dissolution shall operate to impair or invalidate any contract before that time made, or to affect a suit then instituted, or to be instituted by or against said corporation.”

On motion by Mr. Blakistone, the bill was further amended by striking out the word “seventy,” at the end of the 10th section, and inserting in lieu thereof the words, “forty-five.”

On motion by Mr. Blakistone, the bill was further amended, by adding at the end of the bill, the following as an additional section,

“And be it enacted, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to exempt the property of said corporation from the operation of the taxing power of this state.”

The bill having been read a second time as amended, the question was put, shall the bill pass.

Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill reported by Mr. Jones of Somerset, entitled, An act to amend an act, passed at December session, 1832, was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Handy moved to amend the bill by inserting after the word “Pœnix” in the 5th line, the word “steam;”

On which the question was put, and resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Palmer moved to lay the bill on the table.

Determined in the negative.
